Tigers take down UAB to take **AAC** crown; Heads to Seattle for first round of the NCAA

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) --The While Memphis was a lock to make the NCAA Tournament even before tipping off in the American Athletic Conference championship Tournament game, coach Penny Hardaway and the 16th-ranked Tigers got another trophy on the way to Se-

Following the AAC Championship Tournament victory, Memphis men's basketball earned the No. 5 seed in the West Region and will head to Seattle, Washington for the first round of the NCAA Tournament and take on No. 12 seed Colorado State. The matchup is set for Friday, March

PJ Haggerty scored 23 points and Dain Dainja had another double-double with 22 points and 12 rebounds as the Tigers beat UAB 84-72 on Sunday to wrap up the tournament after also winning the league's regular-season title for the first time. Colby Rogers also scored double figures, adding 15 points.

Memphis becomes the first AAC team to win both the regular season and tournament crowns in the same season.

U.S. Sens. Blackburn and Booker introduce **NCAA** Accountability Act to protect athletes, coaches, and colleges

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Senators Marsha Blackburn (R-Tenn.) and Cory Booker (D-N.J.) introduced the NCAA Accountability Act, which would establish due process protections for student-athletes, coaches, and universities that are under investigation by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) for rule violations:

"The NCAA has an unacceptable history of backroom deliberations that unfairly punish athletes, coaches, and universities, and we must ensure student athletes who work their entire lives to compete at the college level are not bogged down by inconsistent investigations conducted by an organization that continues to move the goal post." said Senator Blackburn. "The NCAA Accountability Act would make the NCAA more accountable by ensuring the organization's expectations for rule violations are consistent and fair. As the nation's sports fans tune into the Big Dance, Congress should pass this legislation to protect our athletes and universities."

"College athletes, coaches, and universities deserve clear, consistent procedures during investigations of potential rule violations," said Senator Booker. "This legislation is an important step toward ensuring fairness, transparency, and due processand will help to strengthen trust in college athletics."

"The NCAA Accountability Act would make the NCAA more accountable by ensuring the organization's expectations for rule violations are consistent and fair. As the nation's sports fans tune into the Big Dance, Congress should pass this legislation to protect our athletes and universities."

NCAA ACCOUNTABILITY **ACT**

The NCAA Accountability Act would:

•Establish Due Process:

1. Require the NCAA to provide its member universities with fair notice regarding enforcement proceedings, including information about the status of the investigation, alleged violations being investigated, the involved individuals and programs, the potential penalties of each allegation, and the rights and resources available to the accused.

2. Require the NCAA complete any investigation no later than one year after it begins.

3. Prohibit the NCAA from publicly disclosing information relating to an ongoing investigation until formal charges are filed in the notice of allegations.
