Defensive plays lead to Tennessee Titans win

NASHVILLE, TN, Nov. 26, 2023- The Tennessee Titans fought off the Thanksgiving trypophan to face off against the Carolina Panthers on Sunday afternoon. A seemingly slow start took a turn in the Titans’ favor when Derrick Henry pummeled his way through the Carolina defense to score a 1-yard touchdown with just over 30 seconds remaining in the first quarter. The second quarter saw more action, beginning with a 50-yard field goal by the Panthers’ kicker, Eddy Pineiro. Tennessee was able to extend their lead two drives later, after Arden Key sacked Carolina’s Bryce Young causing him to fumble the ball. Jeffery Simmons recovered the ball for the Titans, setting up a 1st and 10 just 15 yards outside the end zone. Chig Okonkwo

moved the ball 5 yards before Levis handed the ball off to Henry for a 10-yard touchdown, his second of the game.

With just 28 seconds left in the half, the Titans regained possession. A 9-yard gain by Okonkwo followed by an 18-yard gain by Nick Westbrook-Ikhine advanced Tennessee to the Carolina 35-yard line. Nick Folk completed a 53-yard field goal with only 3 seconds remaining to give the Titans a 17-3 lead at the half. The second half would only see one scoring drive. Carolina’s Chuba Hubbard ran the ball into the end zone for a 5-yard touchdown. The point after brought the Panthers within 7 of the Titans roughly halfway through the third quarter. The scoreboard would read the same, 17-10, at the final whistle.

Despite the lackluster offensive drives in the second half, the Tennessee defense stepped up. Both Jeffery Simmons and Denico Autry sacked Carolina’s Young, bringing the sack total to 4 for the game. The Titans improved to 4-7 overall, with all 4 wins coming in front of their home fans.

Tennessee will travel to Indianapolis on Sunday to take on the Colts (6-5) for the second time this season. The Titans fell 16-23 in their first meeting.

NASHVILLE — The Tennessee Titans (4-7) play their second consecutive home game this week, welcoming the division-rival Indianapolis Colts (6-5) to Nissan Stadium (capacity 69,143). Kickoff is scheduled for noon CST on Sunday, Dec. 3. The Titans and Colts met in Indianapolis on Oct. 8 for the first of their two annual matchups. The Colts won 23-16, and in doing so, they broke the Titans' five-game winning streak in the series. This Sunday, each team is expected to have a different starting

quarterback from the one who opened the game on Oct. 8. Titans rookie Will Levis has been in the lineup for each of the past five weeks after Ryan Tannehill started the first six contests. For the Colts, veteran Gardner Minshew II has started ever since rookie Anthony Richardson was injured in the game against the Titans.

The contest will be regionally televised on CBS, including Nashville affiliate WTVF NewsChannel 5, as well as on Paramount+ in the Nashville market. The broadcast team includes


