NASHVILLE, TN - Dec. 17, 2023 - For the final time this season, the Titans donned the throwback baby blue Oilers jerseys, this time as they took on the Houston Texans, the team that eventually replaced the

Tennessee's defense came out strong and created a 3 and out for the Texans. Will Levis and the Titans' offense carried the moment. Derrick Henry converted on a huge 4th and 1. On the next play, Levis found Treylon Burks for a 37-yard gain. A few plays later, Levis threw a deep pass to Nick Westbrook-Ikhine for an additional 33 yards. The Texans

challenged the play but the call on the field stood, setting the Titans up with a first and goal position. The first attempt by Henry was stopped, but on 2nd and 1, Levis drove up the middle and scored his first career rushing touchdown. Nick Folk missed the point after attempt, which would unfortunately come back to haunt the Titans.

The first quarter would end 6-0 in favor of the Titans but they quickly added to that at the beginning of the second. Elijah Molden intercepted a pass from Texans' quarterback Case Keenum and ran the ball to the endzone for a 44-yard touchdown. Folk's point after was good this time, extending the Tennessee lead 13-0.

On the final play of the second quarter, Houston kicker Ka'Imi Fairbairn kicked a 23-yard field goal to cut the Titans' lead to 10 heading into halftime.

The Titans struggled offensively in the third quarter and the Texans took advantage. Fairbairn added two field goals, one from 27 yards and another from 53 yards. This brought the score to 13-9 heading into the final quarter of regulation play.

NASHVILLE — The Tennessee Titans (5-9) host the Seattle Seahawks (6-7*) this week in a Christmas Eve battle at Nissan Stadium (capacity 69,143). Kickoff is scheduled for noon CST on Dec. 24.

The Seahawks will make their third all-time appearance at Nis-



san Stadium and their first since a 33-27 Titans victory on Sept. 24, 2017. The only other meeting in Tennessee was a 28-24 Seahawks triumph on Dec. 18, 2005. Overall, the Titans franchise is 8-10 against the Seahawks. However, the Titans have won three of the last four meetings, including each of the past two. Most recently, Derrick Henry rushed for 182 yards and three touchdowns in a 33-30 overtime victory at Seattle on Sept. 19, 2021.

The contest will be regionally televised on CBS, including Nashville affiliate WTVF News-Channel 5, as well as on Paramount+ in the Nashville market. The broadcast team includes play-by-play announcer Andrew Catalon, analysts Tiki Barber and Matt Ryan, and reporter AJ Ross.
