Seth Cox named AAC Player of the Week

MEMPHIS, Tenn., March 18, 2024 – University of Memphis baseball junior utility player Seth Cox was named the American Athletic Conference (AAC) Player of the Week after helping

the Tigers win four games and a road series at New Orleans with a monster week at the plate, the conference announced Monday.

bases) while smashing three home runs and driving in a dozen runs for a staggering 1.609 OPS on the week.

Cox homered in back-to-back games against North Alabama (March 12) and Arkansas State (March 13) and tallied six RBI in those two games to help Memphis complete the midweek sweep. He cleared the bases with a three-run double Friday night in a 5-4 win at New Orleans and had a 3-for-5 effort in the second game of Saturday's doubleheader (a 12-10 win), driving in three more runs and clubbing his third home run of the week.

On the season, Cox has four home runs and has driven in 17

runs – both tied for third on the club – and his five doubles rank fourth on the squad. His 1.117 OPS trails only teammate Pierre Seals (1.118).

The Tigers hit the road for Starkville, Mississippi, Tuesday afternoon for a midweek matchup with No. 21 Mississippi State (15-4) at Dudy Noble Field before heading to Tampa for conference-opening weekend at South Florida (11-8).
