Grizzlies announce regional broadcast schedule, partnering with FanDuel Sports Network from sports page 1

All Grizzlies regular season games televised on FanDuel Sports Network will be available across Tennessee, Mississippi, Kentucky, Alabama, Missouri, Central and Southern Illinois and Eastern Arkansas through cable, satellite and streaming providers including DIRECTV, Fubo, Mediacom, Spectrum, U-verse TV and Xfinity. For providers in your area, visit GetMyHomeTeams.com. Game telecasts can also be streamed live on the FanDuel Sports Network app and FanDuelSportsNetwork.com. New this season, the FanDuel Sports Network app offers fans an in-game catch-up feature, live, odds integrations and condensed re-airings available immediately after each game concludes. FanDuel Sports Network can be purchased direct-to-consumer with a Season Pass, monthly or annual subscription by visiting FanDuelSportsNetwork.com. It is also available as an add-on subscription through Prime Video by visiting Amazon.com/FDSN.

FanDuel Sports Network will carry all five preseason games starting with the home matchups against the Detroit Pistons on Monday, Oct. 6, at 7 p.m. and the Wednesday, Oct. 8, contest against the Boston Celtics at 7 p.m. along with the Saturday, Oct. 11, preseason game when the Grizzlies host the Atlanta Hawks at 7 p.m. featuring the Grizzlies broadcast team. The network's preseason schedule will also include the Wednesday, Oct. 15, matchup against the Charlotte Hornets at 6 p.m. and Miami Heat on Friday, Oct. 17, at 7 p.m., with both telecasts on FanDuel Sports Network via the Hornets and Heat broadcasts.

The Grizzlies' radio flagship station, 92.9 FM ESPN Radio, will broadcast all five preseason games and 82 regular season contests during the 2025-26 season, featuring play-by-play from Eric Hasseltine and analysts Elliot Perry, Michael Wallace and Lang Whitaker. Hasseltine returns for his 25th season with the team, while Perry enters his 18th season. Coverage begins with the pregame show 30 minutes prior to tip-off, hosted by Jessica Benson and analyst Jon Roser for home broadcasts. Roser and Bennett Doyle will be the pregame and postgame hosts for away game broadcasts. Fans can tune

into the radio broadcast, including pregame and postgame, at 92.9 FM/680 AM or by downloading the official Grizzlies Mobile App. Grizzlies games will be broadcast on 14 different regional radio stations.

After every home game, fans can tune into The Double Post as Benson, Roser and Doyle react instantly at the conclusion of each game. The Double Post is aired simultaneously on 92.9FM/680 AM and the Grind City Media Mobile App, YouTube channel, Facebook and X account.

The Grizzlies will be featured exclusively on nationally televised games on NBC, Peacock and Amazon Prime seven times this season. Memphis' matchups on Friday, Oct. 31, against the Los Angeles Lakers and the NBA London and Berlin Games 2026 on Thursday, Jan. 15, and Sunday, Jan. 18, against the Orlando Magic will be televised exclusively on Amazon Prime. The following games will be televised exclusively on Peacock: Monday, Dec. 22, at Oklahoma City; Monday, Feb. 2, vs. Minnesota and Monday, March 3, at Atlanta. The Grizzlies will host Philadelphia on Tuesday, Dec. 30, exclusively on NBC.

the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens. Almost two months after receiving notice of the Division's investigation, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department provided data and documents that revealed only two approvals from over 8,000 applications, and that the Sheriff's Department set out interviews to approve licenses as far as two years after receiving the completed application. The lawsuit is filed within the Federal Central District of California.

This investigation was conducted by attorneys at the Civil Rights Division and Assistant

U.S. Attorneys within the Central District of California's U.S. Attorney Office.

Rhett Miller releases new single “All Over Again” and gets ready for national tour

OCTOBER 7, 2025: Rhett Miller has released “All Over Again,” the final single from his tenth solo album A lifetime of riding by night that arrives this Friday, October 10 via ATO Records. Co-written with Nicole Atkins, the tender song of hope and resilience poses the poignant question: What if everybody was there for each other just for a minute?

On Monday, Oct. 6, Miller kicked off his national album release tour that will make stops in Los Angeles, Seattle, New York, Dallas, St. Paul and many more. This Sunday, October 12, he will celebrate the album's release with an in-store signing and conversation with Dave Hill at Rough Trade NYC at 3:00 pm. RSVPs are now open. Nicole Atkins adds, "I was out on tour with the Old 97's, it was the first few months of my life being sober on the road and this music and melody came to me. I showed it to Rhett one night and the next day he had all the words and they were so beautiful and positive. Just like Rhett. It's

tough to write a song that's happy but he always has the perfect lyrical twists that are so natural to him."

"All Over Again" follows the release of "All For You" and "Come As You Are," that features Turnpike Troubadours' Evan Felker, who also co-wrote the song, on background vocals. The song was praised by Rolling Stone, BrooklynVegan, Dallas Observer, and Whiskey Riff, who proclaimed, "[Rhett Miller] has managed to stay relevant and inspire generations of artists for well over 30 years. [He] is the type of musician that is likely one of your favorite artist's favorite artists."

Last month, Miller's band Old 97's was honored with a lifetime achievement award at the 24th annual Americana Honors & Awards in Nashville, TN, with Variety noting "The loudest and rowdiest performance of the night, hands down, belonged to the Old 97's"

A lifetime of riding by night was recorded primarily at Dave's Room in Los Angeles and marks Miller's first time enlisting his Old 97's bandmate Murry Hammond as a producer since his solo debut album Mythologies (a 1989 LP created when he was 17-years-old). Threaded with his lived-in reflection on mortality and love in all forms, the album

contains some of Miller's most unguarded material yet—an achievement he attributes to revelations gleaned through his recent work in teaching songwriting at The New School in Manhattan, as well as the eclectic lineup of co-writers including Turnpike Troubadours frontman Evan Felker, Caitlin Rose, Nicole Atkins, Jesse Valenzuela of Gin Blossoms, and Ben Greenman.

Titans make first trip to Allegiant Stadium

NASHVILLE — The Tennessee Titans (1-4) play their third consecutive road game this week, traveling to play for the first time in Las Vegas at Allegiant Stadium (capacity65,000). Kickoff against the Raiders (1-4) is scheduled for 1:05 p.m. PDT/3:05 p.m. CDT on Sunday, Oct. 12.The last time Tennessee traveled to face the Raiders was 2019, the Raiders' final season in Oakland before they relocated to Las Vegas in 2020. Tennessee took that matchup 42-21 and won the next meeting at Nissan Stadium, a 24-22 win on Sept. 25,2022. However, the Raiders maintain a 30-22 advantage in the all-time series, including the postseason.

The contest will be regionally televised on FOX, including Nashville affiliate WZTVFOX 17. The broadcast team includes play-by-play announcer Kenny Albert, analyst Jonathan Vilma and reporter Megan Olivi. Fans in Nashville can stream live Titans games on mobile devices with NFL+, which offers access to local games and all primetime games on phones and tablets. Out of market, fans can watch every Sunday afternoon game with Sunday Ticket. More information on ways to watch NFL games can be found atnfl.com/ways-to-watch. The Titans Radio Network and Nashville flagship 104.5 The Zone carry all Titans games across the Mid-South with play-by-play announcer Taylor Zarzour, analyst

Dave McGinnis, executive producer Rhett Bryan, game day host Lucas Panzica, and sideline reporters Amie Wells and Will Boling. Additionally, Compass Media Networks will broadcast the game to a national radio audience. Play-by-play announcer Kevin Ray and analyst Brian Baldinger have the call.

The Titans visited Arizona last week and won in dramatic fashion. After they trailed21-3 in the first half and 21-6 in the fourth quarter, Joey Slye made a 29-yard field goal as time expired in the fourth quarter to complete the 22-21 comeback win. The Titans registered their largest fourth-quarter comeback victory since overcoming a 21-point deficit to defeat the New York Giants 24-21 on Nov. 26, 2006.Since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, the only other game won by the Titans franchise after trailing by 15 or more points in the fourth quarter

was Nov. 1, 1987 against Cincinnati, when the team erased a 15-point margin to win 31-29.No. 1 overall draft pick Cam Ward started for the fifth consecutive week to begin the season and was credited with his first career win and his first career game-winning drive. In the fourth quarter, he was 13-of-18 passing for 193 yards. Since 2000, Ward and the Titans 'Vince Young(Nov. 26, 2006) are the only NFL rookie quarterbacks to win a game in which they trailed by 15 or more points in the fourth quarter. Ward's top target was wide receiver Calvin Ridley, who finished with five receptions for 131 yards. It was the sixth-highest receiving yardage total of Ridley's career. On defense, the Titans were led by 1.5 sacks by defensive tackle Jeffery Simmons. Simmons' 3.5 total sacks this season are tied for his best total of his career(2022) through five

games and lead all NFL defensive tackles in 2025.THE RAIDERS The Raiders are led by Pete Carroll, who was named head coach in January. He previously spent 14 seasons as the head coach of the Seattle Seahawks, directing the franchise to consecutive Super Bowl appearances and a Super Bowl XLVIII victory following the 2013 campaign. Quarter back Geno Smit his also in his initial season in Las Vegas after a previous stint in Seattle.

He has started each of the first five games of 2025. Since 2022, Smith's13,402 passing yards rank fourth in the NFL, and his 77 touchdown passes rank ninth. The Raiders won their 2025 season opener at New England before suffering losses in their past four contests. Last week they traveled to Indianapolis, where the Colts won 40-6
